### **BREAKING NEWS CHICAGO**

The afternoon of May 30<sup>th</sup> and the news of the murder of George Floyd protesters started to build in the downtown area. Before you knew it, the protest turned into a looting riot in downtown Chicago. Thousands hit the streets, setting cars on fire and breaking windows in major stores.



Police were put on 12-hour shifts. The protests and looting went well into the early morning hours. The next day looting and fires went into the neighborhoods. The Fire Department set up 7 Task Forces consisting of 2 Engines 1, Truck 1, 1 Battalion Chief and 2 ambulances. They were spread out in the problem areas. They were sent on most working fires. When nightfall came, that is when it hit the fan.



Fire were on the south and west side of the city. From 22:00 hrs. Until 04:00 we had over 85 fires. Some went to a Still and Box, but many were held to a Still Alarm with help of the Task Forces. Over the 3 days there were 3 extra alarms at 228 S Wabash, 304 E 47<sup>th</sup> St and 95<sup>th</sup> and Jeffery Ave.

The 5-11 Club Canteens stayed terribly busy during the 3 nights. Canteen 401 was at the Quinn Fire Academy supplying meals to the 7 Task Forces that were switched out for a little break. Canteen 405 responded to several fires. Canteen 404 kept us supplied with drinks and food.

# 3-11 Alarm 79<sup>th</sup> St & Vincennes, May 19, 2020

Engine 122 arriving on scene reporting fire in a 2 story apartments over commercial. Fire on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor. Battalion 19 reports fire in 3 story apartments over commercial 75X125 fire on the B, C side. Several minutes later the Still and Box was pulled. 2-2-5 arrived on the scene and requested a 2-11 alarm. The fire was now through the roof. Currently 2 Tower Ladders, Snorkel and multiple hand lines working. Request for the Hose Wagon from Engine 81. 2-1-25 arrived and soon requested a 3-11 alarm, an EMS Plan 1 and a Level 1 Hazmat. Fire was thru the roof and communicated to a 2<sup>nd</sup> building. A request for 2 extra Truck Company's. The fire was in for a while before striking the fire out by 2-1-4.



## 2-11 Alarm 228 S. Wabash Ave May 30, 2020

Battalion 1 and companies responded to a report of a fire at the location. Upon arrival Battalion 1 reported smoke showing from a Health Food Store. A Task Force was assigned to the fire with a full still. Soon it was discovered the fire was in the basement and requested a Still and Box. 2-2-1 took command of the fire and requested the Hi X foam truck. Moments later the 2-11 was struck. The fire was in for about an hour before being Struck out.







## 2-11 Alarm 304 East 47<sup>th</sup> St May 31, 2020

Battalion 2 reported on scene with a fire in a 1 story row of stores. The fire went to a Still and Box. The fire was in for quite a while when a MAYDAY was called for. This elevated the fire to a 2-11 alarm and a EMS Plan 1. Injured Firefighter was removed and taken to the hospital in good condition.



# 2-11 Alarm 95<sup>th</sup> St and Jeffery Ave June 1, 2020

Battalion 24 reported at location with a fire in a 1 story commercial building. The Still and Box was requested for heavy fire in a 1 story Dollor Story. Later a 2-11 was requested. Several hand lines working with Tower Ladders working. Fire was struck out by 2-1-33.



## Fill Still of Box 21-09 Blue Island June 2, 2020

Canteen 405 responded Mutial Aid to Blue Island for a fire in a 2.5 story frame dwelling. 3 lines on the fire.

## 2-11 Alarm 6535 S. Halsted St June 3, 2020

Battalion 19 responded to a Still Alarm at 6535 S Halsted St. Upon arrival smoke showing from a 1 and 4 story building. Engine 54 leading out and ladder to the roof. Battalion 19 requesting a Still and Box with a special call for an extra truck. The building is boarded up and can't get access. All trucks bring their saws to the front of building with their fans. Air Mask Truck requested to the scene. Battalion 19 reports 125x75 commercial building. 3 lines on the fire. 2-2-1 reported on scene and requested 2 extra trucks and the Rehab Unit. A few moments later 2-2-1 request a 2-11 Alarm for manpower. Canteens 403 & 405 responded. Fire was struck out later by 2-1-28.

Canteens 401 and 405 detailed to the Quinn Fire Academy. June 9, 2020 Canteens 401 & 405 were detailed to the Quinn Academy for the day and evening due to the funeral of George Floyd. The Fire Dept was running 3 Task Forces from the academy.

### 2-11 Alarm 11253 Michigan Ave June 9, 2020

Battalion 22 responded to a Still Alarm. Upon arrival, fire reported in a Beauty Shop. Working Fire was started in with a Task Force. Battalion 22 requested a Still and Box for a fire in a 2 story beauty shop boarded up. 3 lines on the fire. 2-2-5 took command of the fire. Requested the 2-11 alarm for manpower. The fire was in a 2 story commercial building 75x100. Canteen 405 responded from the Quinn Acadmey. Fire was later struck out by 2-1-28





### MABAS Box Alarm # 22-09 at 12935 S Throop St Calumet Park June 10, 2020

Calumet Park FD reported a fire in a 1 story commercial building. Command requested Full Still of Box 22-09. Command reporting fire in a 1 story commercial 100x100 Fire through the roof. MABAS Box Alarm requested. Canteens 402 and 405 were due mutual aid on the Box.






## 2-11 Alarm 6825 S Perry Ave June 13, 2020

Battalion 19 and the group responding to a Still Alarm at 6825 S Perry. While enroute the Englewood Fire Alarm Office struck a Still and Box. Upon arrival Battalion 19 reported fire in a 3 story courtyard building with jumpers. Battalion 19 requested 2 extra trucks and all trucks report with their 35 foot ladders. Battalion 19 quickly pulled a 2-11 alarm with an EMS Plan 1. Canteen 403 was responding, but healed up enroute to the fire. Battalion 19 reports 2 lines on the fire people hanging from window ledges. A short time later the fire was struck out by 2-1-30







All Canteens were put into service for Juneteeth protests. Canteens 402 and 405 requested by CPD to go into service at Ida B. Wells and Michigan. Canteen 401 to the Quinn Fire Academy for CFD Task Forces. All protest were fairly quiet.

Ford Heights receiver an E One Typhoon Engine. 1000/780 Engine Company 210


Evergreen Park took delivery of an E One Cyclone Engine. 1500/530 Engine Company 77

The new Chicago Trucks are starting to roll in. The 1st four should be going to Truck 30, 40, 49 and 52.


Lansing Fire Dept took delivery of a E One Typhoon X long Cab 1500/530.
